Invasive species are detrimental to our land; they can inhibit habitat by reducing nut bearing trees and forage, they can block views, restrict drainage and create a nuisance for pets, they outcompete desirable species in regeneration or reforestation situations, and they change the ecosystem, making it undesirable for native wildlife species. This workshop will give landowners the knowledge and resources necessary to manage invasive species on their land.



Anne Pearce, Coordinator of the First Detector Network, will present on the GLEDN app (for smart phones and tablets) and the ISMTrack software and their applicability to private land management. This app is not only a mapping tool, but can also hold control information and photos linked to a GPS point and allow users to track infestations and control efforts over time.



Jeni Klein, Calumet County Terrestrial Invasive Species Coordinator, will present on land restoration including methods of invasive species control and restoration of native species.



Matt Rataczak, NRCS District Conservationist, will present on two cost-share programs NRCS can offer landowners working on removing invasive species and restoring their land; the Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP) and the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP).

A demonstration of the GLEDN app will take place outside after the presentations.
